

We are launching the first edition of the InCIAM-ISSCI Conference & Summer School on Creativity.

This scientific event, focused on "Multidisciplinary exploration of creativity: Understanding creative processes for research innovations", will take place at Aix-Marseille University (in Aix-en-Provence, France) and is scheduled to last 5 days (from June 2nd to June 6th, 2025). It is co-organized by the Institute on Creativity and Innovations of Aix-Marseille (InCIAM), the International Society for the Study of Creativity and Innovation (ISSCI), and the Research Center in Psychology of Cognition, Language and Emotion (PSYCLE).

Organizers: Prof. Nathalie Bonnardel (Aix-Marseille University, InCIAM, PSYCLE, ISSCI) in collaboration with the International Society for the Study of Creativity and Innovation (ISSCI) chaired by Prof. Todd Lubart.

This scientific event combines the specific features of an international conference with workshop-based activities designed to promote and stimulate research into creativity. Thus, this scientific event has a dual objective:

(1) To enable doctoral and post-doctoral students as well as researchers to benefit over 5 days from scientific communications (see scientific program below) delivered by renowned international researchers in the field of creativity, while encouraging the identification of emerging research questions and exchanges between participants.
(2) To enable young researchers (including doctoral and post-doctoral students) to become actively involved in developing and proposing research projects, under the supervision of international "senior" researchers, experts in the field of creativity. These last activities will enable collective intelligence to emerge with a view to crossing perspectives, and ensuring collaboration between young researchers from different countries. Exchanges with international experts and with doctoral and post-doctoral students, whether formal or informal, will also help weave a network of research and lasting collaborations.

The Conference & Summer School will be based on:

- Theoretical knowledge to better define concepts and facets related to creativity.
- Methodological knowledge to allow doctoral students and researchers to boost their research.
- Networking to foster interdisciplinary and international connections.
- Collective reflective workshops offering participants the opportunity to develop research related to the subject of the conference & summer school.

This event is free.

Coffee breaks are included.

Meals, lodging, and travel are the participants' responsibility.

The number of participants being limited, **registration is required before April 11th**, **2025**, and inscriptions will be handled on first come, first served basis.
